



Above: Announcing the first games. Front cover of the May 1980 edition of Backhill


Below: OGI 1980 Results table as printed in the July edition of Backhill


In 1978 during a meeting of the then St. Peter's Italian Catholic Youth Club Committee, a certain Rob Verbini made the suggestion that the club should organise a sporting event in which it could invite all the Italian clubs and associations of the UK to take part in.

In the ensuing debate, most agreed that it was a good idea in principle but there were the usual concerns of how it could be funded.

In most circumstances that would have been that, a good idea which ultimately came to nothing. However, the President of the youth club, a certain Victor Heissl, not only liked the idea but believed that it had to be done and the money found. And so the die was cast, the wheels set in motion, as The Olimpiade della Gioventù Italiana UK, as they were to become known, were born.

For the next 18 months the youth club was a hive of activity as invites were sent out, fundraisers staged and a venue found. As the replies came in, from as far afield as Scotland, it became obvious that these games were going to be far bigger than had previously been imagined. Without the aid of computers, committee members such as Vince DeStefano, Felix De Palma, Giv Croci, Renzo Zani and Rob Verbini to name a few, would burn the midnight oil in the youth club, planning the timetable and making sure that events would not clash.

And on Saturday 24th May 1980, the fruit of their labour came into being when over 500 young people from across the UK marched onto the track of Barnet Copthall Stadium for the opening ceremony of the first OGI games.
